### Introduction

The past decade has been a difficult one for the forest industry and the communities it supports. The changes that have occurred in the forest industry are permanent with many mills permanently closed. Over the past year there have been some positive trends: lumber and oriented strand board prices are up, pulp prices have stabilized and there is increased demand in all markets. With this improvement, some facilities have reopened and others have added shifts to meet improved demands.

Over the past year, the Fundy Model Forest (FMF) has begun to make the shift as well. With improving markets, some of the challenges have shifted as well. The sector must still address the oversupply of low grade timber. In addition, with improved markets, come increased demand for labour. Many of the workers that left the sector will never come back. This coupled with low numbers entering forestry based programs, has created a dearth of available workers.

Over the past year the FMF has focused on:

- Ensure efficient administration of the funding and programs associated with the FMF,
- Investigated the shift in sector needs for organizations like the FMF,
- Deliver projects that contribute to the knowledge and education of our partners,
- > Supported partners in the delivery of projects relevant to their organizations.
